To Whom it May Concern,

This letter of Commendation is for Deacon **HECTOR IBARRA**, President representing Labor of Faith (a not-for-profit organization) that has provided "perishable" donated food items, twice weekly, for the Wheelhouse's Recovery Center - Residential Programs. This voluntary service has been provided for the past eight years. Mr. Ibarra's generous, selfless work is a "blessing" to our organization, the recovering men residing at our facility and the neighboring community.

The Wheelhouse, Inc. is a Non-profit, Tax-Exempt Organization under Section 501(C)(3) of the IRS Code {Cert. #76-0022034}. The Wheelhouse was established in 1952 and our main objective continues to be the rehabilitation of the chronic alcoholic who is sincere in their desire to stay sober. Our program is solely based upon the intensive study and understanding of the Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions of Alcoholics Anonymous (AA).

We are primarily a 30+ day Men's (FREE) detoxification facility. However, our "recovering men" may elect to stay longer when admitted to the Wheelhouse's '3/4-House Residency Program'. Each occupant of the Phase I '30+ Day Detox Program' is required to attend three (3) AA meetings each day, including an "open meeting" at night. All of these meetings are conducted on-site. Residents are not allowed to leave the premises during their Phase I Program commitment. Phase II, 3/4-House Residents may work outside the Wheelhouse to pay their portion of weekly rent, but are required to attend one, AA meeting each day. They must return to the Wheelhouse each night, subject to alcohol/drug screening rule compliance to continue on-premises housing. Mentoring/Sponsorship opportunities are offered to individuals that have thoroughly participated in all of the Wheelhouse's Recovery Programs and continue to demonstrate the AA 12-Step Program fundamentals in their daily lives.

The Wheelhouse strives to afford each resident the opportunity to incorporate the principles of Alcoholics Anonymous into their daily lives and therefore to learn how to live sober one day at a time. **This letter of Commendation is for Deacon Hector Ibarra, President representing Labor of Faith, a non-profit organization that has provided clothing, infants and children's food, food items for adults, bibles, appliances, blankets, pillows, beds, and many other household items too numerous to write to the newly arrived immigrants and the most needy families in Cameroon, Africa. These voluntary services have been provided for the last seven years. Mr. Ibarra's magnanimous, bountiful, charitable, noble, whole-hearted, forgiving, and generous contributions have been a magnanimous journey beyond compare to our community in Cameroon. Deacon Hector Ibarra is the most generous benefactor to our Claretians Missionaries in Cameroon. I spend one week in his home in Pearland, Texas. He paid for all my expenses and helped me raise funds for our Community in late September of 2016. He and his Community have been sending funds ever since then.**

**After I left Houston, I went to California to raise funds. Our Community had to pay for my travel expenses. Then flew by airplane to Minneapolis, Minnesota to stay with some family members. Deacon Hector Ibarra drove all the way from Houston, Texas without sleep for 36 hours in order to save himself money in order to donate that money that he saved to our Community. Before he arrived at the house where I was staying, he called me to please find a Celebration of the Eucharist in order that together we could attend. Three minutes after he arrived we were on our way to Mass. Before Mass he asked me to hear his confession. I found that Deacon Ibarra has a tremendous devotion to Our Lady of Guadalupe. He had been attending daily Mass for 17 years. That was the reason that he ask me to find a Mass close to where I was residing.**

**For the next 3 weeks in August of 2016, Deacon Hector was able to drive me in his car to four different Parishes in three different States in order that I could Celebrate Mass at those Parishes and give the Priests a week vacation. I was given permission to ask for a second Collection at each Mass to help our Claretians Missionaries in Cameroon.**

**We in Cameroon strive to afford assistance to those refugee families that are resent arrivals from North, East, and West countries in Africa that arrive with nothing but their children on their backs. We also assist these families that suffer because without our assistance a tremendous number these children and adults would die from hunger. We also assist them with medical supplies. We provide education and Evangelization opportunities to these the most in need in Africa.**

Deacon Ibarra has been donating to our Community for seven years since I met him at a Mass Celebration in Mary Queen Catholic Church in Friendswood, Texas. He was moved by the Holy Spirit to come and introduce himself to me. What is the statistical probability that this would happen? One in 3 billion is my estimation. He invited me to coffee and breakfast and when I explained our dire situation he started to donate money to our Community.

I estimate that Deacon Hector Ibarra has adopted 77 orphans in Cameroon. He has assisted to feed 1900 refugees that perhaps would have perished from hunger without his help. He has helped my 120 Seminarians that are under my supervision for their 4 year Philosophy College Education immensely by paying for their food and supplies. estimate this assistance from the Almsgiving, benevolence, Charity, will leave a great legacy that he has acquired in Cameroon. I include the assistance he provided for me in August of 2016. Currently he is donating monthly to the checking account that I have established in Pearland, Texas where Deacon Hector resides.
